ST JOHN'S QUINQUENNIAL AND DRAINAGE REPORTS 2024-25

The report of the obligatory 5-year inspection by the architect Jonathan Rhind and Associates came to us during December. It is a thorough appraisal of the church fabric and the churchyard. The report contains recommendations for immediate action, and lists for the next two-year period, five-year period, and the period beyond that. It is a 51-page document, a copy of which will be available at the back of the church for general scrutiny but not to be taken away. In addition, there will be copies of a four-page summary of some of the most salient points, available to be read and can be taken.

The recent Drainage Report carried out by Corbel is the most thorough inspection and report done for many years. Using experts with line-camera, computer data, and flushing equipment we have been confronted with a greater understanding of the drainage system that relies almost entirely on soak-aways. They have become very inefficient and seriously silted just as climate change is handing our beautiful building much more rainwater!

A four-page extract, from what is a very technical document, is posted on the board nearest the font.
