Patronal Festival Weekend 21-22 June Saint John the Baptist

The Patronal Festival Weekend starts on the Saturday afternoon, 21st June, with our legendary cream teas being served from 3.00 to 5.00 p.m. The occasion is an opportunity to raise funds for fabric and improvement work required for our wonderful church dedicated to St John the Baptist. Admission will be £4. The tea and food are FREE.

On the Sunday, in addition to the usual 9.30 a.m. Eucharist, there will be a Festival Evensong at 5 p.m. led by the choir, *Ad hoc Voices*. The music will include the anthem 'This is the Record of John' composed in the 1600s by Orlando Gibbons and the Canticles by the same composer. ALL are invited including members of other churches.

Did you know?

Some scholars maintain that John the Baptist belonged to the Essenes, a semiascetic Jewish sect who expected a messiah and practised ritual baptism. Most biblical scholars agree that John baptised Jesus, and several New Testament accounts report that some of Jesus's early followers had previously been followers of John. According to the New Testament, John was sentenced to death and subsequently beheaded by Herod Antipas around AD 30 after John had rebuked him for divorcing his wife Phasaelis and then unlawfully marrying Herodias, the wife of his brother Herod Philip I.

In the Roman martyrology, apart from Jesus and the Virgin Mary, John is the only saint whose birth and death are both commemorated.
